- 1. Consider who is receiving the text. Be sure all texts are appropriate enough for your grandma to read.
- 2. Communicate clearly. Re-read your texts before pressing send to be sure there are no misspellings or incorrect punctuation.
- 3. Respond promptly but do not expect your reader to.
- 4. Never respond to rude, mean, crude, or inappropriate texts.
- 5. Never respond to a number you do not know, even by asking "who is this."
- 6. Only use symbols and emojis when necessary. Too many of either will clutter a message and are not cute.
- 7. Do not text more than twice if the person has not responded.
- 8. Never texts in all caps. IT SEEMS LIKE YELLING.
- 9. Do not text more than 3 or 4 lines. If you need to say that much, make a phone call or wait until you are face to face.
- 10. Never argue over text.
- 11. Never send anything private over text.
- 12. Know when to end the conversation. If the person hasn't text you back, be patient.
